Life in our Solar System

For many years, a primary focus of the search for extraterrestrial life has been the planets, moons, and minor objects of the Solar System itself. Recently, the list of possible locations in our Solar System for life (past or present) has grown. This talk will focus on these latest developments with a special emphasis on Mars, the Galilean Satellites of Jupiter, and the moon Titan.
